The Supreme Court, in its judgment dated May 30, 2022, has held that a liability in respect of a claim arising out of a recovery certificate under the Recovery of Debts and Bankruptcy Act, 1993, would be a *financial debt* within the meaning of Section 5(8) of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016 and a holder of such recovery certificate would be a *financial creditor* under Section 5(7) of the IBC. United States Terminates Double Tax Treaty with Hungary

Guatemala

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Legitimate Defense

Legitimate defense is a right granted by law to an individual, allowing him to use the necessary appropriate force to ward off an illegal situation that threatens him, his honor, his money, or the honor or money of a third party, in a way that makes it impossible to resort to the competent authorities to avoid this danger in a timely manner. United Arab Emirates

UAE Economic Substance Regulations

Dubai: Announces New Rules for Digital Services Provision

On March 14, 2022, the Vice President and Ruler of Dubai, Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid, announced the enforcement of Law No. (9) of 2022 *Regulating the Provision of Digital Services* in the Emirate of Dubai to improve and enhance the quality of digital services in Dubai, as well as to drive the emirate's digital transformation journey. The law complements the federal digital and data laws in the UAE and mandates all government departments to offer online services in multiple languages with no additional cost for the customer.
